Pinot Grigio, Via Nova

£6.50 | £20.00

Italy | Veneto

A 100% Pinot Grigio sourced from the Veneto region in North East Italy. Pinot Grigio accounts for one in ten bottles of wine sold in the UK today and this is a great example. Lemony on the nose, with a delicious balance in the mouth, this is a very easy-to-drink dry white with a gorgeous lingering finish. Excellent as an aperitif and a great palate cleanser.

Markview Chardonnay, McWilliams

Australia | New South Wales

Few have helped shape the evolution of the Australian wine industry like McWilliam's Wines. From humble beginnings on the outskirts of Corowa in 1877, the philosophy of putting quality fruit first has ensured that McWilliam's continues to be one of Australia's most popular, respected and iconic wineries. With six generations of winemakers and more the 140 years' experience, theirs are wines that tell the story of a family's long love affair with their craft. Pale straw yellow, with a welcoming palate of fresh fruit and oak. Pleasant, creamy texture with a little sweetness and a soft finish. An excellent choice with creamy dishes.

Sauvignon Blanc, Whakapapa

New Zealand | Gisborne

Gisborne is the first wine region in the world to see the new day's sun and is thoroughly steeped in Maori culture. The winery took influence from this region when naming this wine - 'Papa' is anything broad, flat and hard such as a flat rock. 'Whakapapa' is to place in layers, lay one upon another reflecting the complex nature of this unique Sauvignon Blanc from New Zealand's fourth-largest wine growing region. Deliciously crisp and fresh, packed full of vibrant and long lasting lime, gooseberry and tropical fruit flavours. A lovely wine with fish.

Columbia Valley Riesling, Chateau Ste. Michelle

USA | Washington

Ste Michelle's Columbia Valley Riesling is a blend of 100% Riesling from throughout Washington's Columbia Valley. The winemaker's goal is to craft a refreshing, flavoursome, medium Riesling vintage after vintage, and this is no exception. The wine offers crisp apple flavours with subtle mineral notes; a wine that is an absolute pleasure to drink on its own or with a wide variety of foods and in particular spicy food as the slight sweetness on the palate is the perfect compliment.

Grüner Veltliner Vom Haus, Pfaffl

Austria | Niederosterreich

Pfaffl stands for consistent high quality. This was true in the hands of Roman Pfaffl and has not changed with the new generation. After all, Roman Josef Pfaffl has the same quality aspiration and openness to innovation as his father. The winery is recognised far beyond Austria's borders for its achievements with the country's premier variety Grüner Veltliner. Riesling, Chardonnay, Zweigelt, and St. Laurent under Pfaffl's rhombusshaped label also receive numerous accolades. The American magazine Wine Enthusiast named Pfaffl European Winery of the Year 2016. This is an award given only to the very best in the international wine. Highly recommended.

Pinot Gris, Yealands

£29.00

New Zealand | Marlborough

According to conventional wisdom, you weren't supposed to be able to plant vineyards in the rugged foothills of the Awatere Valley. Thankfully, Peter Yealands saw beyond conventional wisdom. Long hours and unstinting determination brought about a gradual, sympathetic transformation of the landscape and the creation of the remarkable Seaview Vineyard - the largest privately-held wine estate in New Zealand. Given the scale of the undertaking, it's apt that Peter's vision also encompassed the foundation of a business that sets a gold standard in terms of environmental sustainability, from its carbon neutral winery to the widespread adoption of low-impact winemaking methods. Of course, a remarkable vineyard and a green approach don't guarantee success, but this is arguably the Southern Hemisphere's finest all-round producer of aromatic white wines. Aromas of poached pears and melon, with underlying notes of quince and ginger. A full bodied and luscious palate, showing a fine balance between texture, fruit weight and acidity. Stunning.

Sancerre, Domaine des Vieux Pruniers

France | Loire

Situated in the village of Bué in the heart of Sancerre, Christian Thiroit's family have been making wine in this region for several generations and this Sancerre is a classic expression of cool climate Sauvignon Blanc. The grapes are harvested from vineyards located only on the slopes of the Sancerre region, which increases drainage and exposure to sunlight in order to maximise quality. The nose is clean and fresh with enticing lemon and leafy green aromas. The palate is full of citrus and mineral fruits leading into the dry, crisp finish.

Sauvignon Blanc, Cloudy Bay

£39.00

New Zealand | Marlborough

Innovation, meticulous attention to detail and regional expression are the guiding principles of Cloudy Bay. Modern winemaking technology and traditional vinification techniques are combined to produce a range of wines that individually express the flavour, balance and spirit of Cloudy Bay. Considered to be the purest expression of terroir in the Marlborough region, Cloudy Bay sauvignon blanc is made from nine different plots of land. Made with grapes that are harvested by hand in cool evening temperatures to preserve their aromas, this wine owes its fruity character to the region's maritime climate. Pale straw green in colour and enticingly fragrant, the 2007 Cloudy Bay Sauvignon Blanc is reminiscent of a fresh summer fruit salsa - ripe peach, passionfruit, mango and juicy citrus. The palate is rich and succulent, with a zesty citrus and apple-sherbet acidity that leads to a long, lingering, and characteristically crisp finish. Sublime with our fish dishes.

Puligny Montrachet, Domaine Jean Louis Chavy

France | Burgundy

Puligny gained permission in 1879 to hyphenate the name of its most famous vineyard, Montrachet, to its own. Today, the reputation of Puligny-Montrachet is based around its four Grands Crus and, of these, many consider Montrachet to be the greatest white wine in the world. At its best it has an intensity, complexity and elegance that make you wonder how such a wine could be made from mere grapes. Neither overtly fruity nor over-oaked, Jean-Louis Chavy's wines are extremely well balanced, emphasising the classic minerality of Puligny-Montrachet. A model of finesse and elegance made from 100% Chardonnay. The Connoisseur's choice.

Sangiovese Merlot Rubicone £6.50 | £20.00
IGT Fonte della Vigna

Italy | Emilia Romagna

The ever-popular Merlot grape combines with Italy's famous Sangiovese grape to produce this lovely soft but characterful wine. Intense red ruby color, with violet hue. Intense and complex nose of cherry, blackberry, violet, sweet spice and dye flowers, with light oaky hint. Gentle and charming on the palate, with smooth tan-nins, proper freshness, and delicious mineral finish.

Caracter Shiraz/Malbec, £21.00
Bodegas Santa Ana

Argentina | Mendoza

Founded in 1891 by Don Luis Tirasso, Santa Ana proudly positioned itself amongst the first wine producers in South America due to his pioneering approach to viticulture and vinification. Santa Ana has come a long way since then, and has earned over 100 International awards during the last 25 Years and have built up an envia-ble clutch of vineyards in the high valleys within the foot hills of the Andes - here the steep slopes of the mountains provide natural thaw irrigation and a great diversity of aspects and soil types, resulting in a complexity of sites suitable for various grape varieties, which are planted specifically for the micro-climate. An attractively vibrant, youth-ful shade of red with a fruit driven nose of redcurrants and spices. The palate is medium bodied, soft and easily approachable, offering an array of red fruit flavours with balancing structure and a dry, rounded finish. Very versatile.

Cabernet Sauvignon £7.50 | £25.00
Les Mougeottes IGP Pays d'Oc

France | Languedoc-Roussillon

The Cabernet Sauvignon grape varietal is a cross between Cabernet Franc and Sauvignon Blanc sometime during the 1600s. It is now the world's most widely planted grape and known for making some of it's finest red wines. This is a spicy and warm cabernet, with hints of coffee and plenty of ripe dark fruit. On the palate it is full-bodied firm and soft tannins, blackcurrant fruit, and subtle vanillin flavours of new oak. A fabulous match for red meats.

Bosstok Pinotage, MAN Family Wines £27.00

South Africa | Western Cape

MAN Family Wines began in 2001 when three friends got together with the aim of making wine that they'd love to buy. Next they needed a name that would unite their three families, but particularly appeal to their wives after they'd unsuccessfully convinced them that their winemaking venture was a sacrifice rather than a lot of fun. To keep the peace in the families, they took their wives' initials - Marie, Anette and Nicky - to create MAN Family Wines. They are supported by 30 dedicated grape growers from the Agter-Paarl region who are also shareholders in the business. All MAN growers are accredited as environmentally sustainable and socially responsible farmers by the South African Integrated Production of Wine scheme and the South African Wine Industry Ethical Trade Association. Production may have grown from just 300 cases made in a tractor shed to over 175,000 cases per year, but they still make wines that are modern and distinctive with a touch of Old World elegance. Deep ruby red in the glass, it's bold and juicy with red-berry fruit flavours and a touch of sweet oak spice. Pinotage goes well with a wide range of foods, but the sweet fruit flavours make it an ideal match for spicy curries.

Estacion 1883 Malbec, Trapiche £28.00

Argentina | Mendoza

The history of Trapiche begins in 1883, in a small vineyard called El Trapiche, in the district of Godoy Cruz, Mendoza, where the grapes for the first fine wines were grown. With more than 130 years of experience, Trapiche has earned its place as a pioneering winery and today Trapiche is in a continuous quest for the latest best practices. Led by Daniel Pi, Director of Winemaking, Trapiche's winemaking team permanently strives to improve winemaking practices by exchanging experience and knowledge with winemakers from other wine producing countries such as France, the US, Australia and New Zealand. This Malbec has notes of ripe red fruits, cherries and violets with an underlying minerality and an elegant finish.

Land Made Pinot Noir, Yealands £29.00

New Zealand | South Island

Yealands Winery sets the gold standard in terms of environmentally friendly wine making. They even have miniature sheep called Baby Dolls living and grazing these beautiful vineyards. These knee-high cuties act as nature's lawnmowers whilst naturally fertilising the land resulting in the beautiful wines they create. This lovely Pinot Noir offers ripe plum aromas with a touch of spice. The juicy ripe red fruit flavours lead into a supple, soft tannin finish. A beautiful match to lamb.

Rioja Reserva, Ramón Bilbao £30.00

Spain | Rioja

Bodegas Ramón Bilbao was founded in 1924 by Ramón Bilbao Murgo in Haro. He was an experienced wine trader and a pioneer in the art of ageing (Reserva Rioja has to be aged for a minimum of 3 years before release.) The winery stayed family owned until 1966, when Ramón Bilbao Pozo, last of the descendants, died. In 1999 the winery was acquired by the family business of Diego Zamora. The winery got renovated, with new facilities and top-quality wines were produced thanks to a great combination of innovation and tradition of la Rioja Alta. Lovely garnet colour with medium-high depth of colour. Clear and bright. When the glass is twirled you can see its legs. Sumptuous and classical in style with good use of American oak. Aromas of blackberries, cedar, leather and spices. Good balance on the palate with a long finish. This wine pairs perfectly with curried dishes and spicy dishes.

Amarone della Valpolicella, Le Vigne £38.00

Italy | Veneto

Amarone is the finest expression of the red wine, Valpolicella, which hails exclusively from the Veneto in Northern Italy. Individual parcels of Rondinella, Corvina and Molinara were selected for their concentration and ripeness then vinified separately. The grapes were dried, or 'raisined' in special drying lodges to reduce the water content and further increase concentration. This was then fermented dry and aged in oak before blending the individual parcels together before bottling. The Classico zone is the first delimited zone from which the original Amarones were made and therefore contains the original soils and microclimates that have given this style of wine its international reputation. Deep almost opaque in colour with a pronounced nose of morello cherries interspersed with layers of oak and spice. On the palate is rich and powerful with strong tannins and considerable texture and complexity. This is a powerful wine of great character and beautiful with lamb dishes.

Châteauneuf du Pape, £48.00

Domaine Chante Cigale

France | Rhône

Domaine Chante Cigale is situated on the left bank of the Rhône, between Orange and Sorgues, on a variety of soils which contain a high proportion of 'galets'. These are the large stones of Châteauneuf-du-Pape which heat up during the day, and release their heat at night, allowing the grapes to achieve maximum ripeness. Thirteen grape varieties are permitted in the production of this iconic wine with the dominance of Grenache and Syrah. The red is powerful, with defined fruit characters and supple tannins. It offers a wonderful nose of spice and dark fruits followed by a rich, ripe palate with layers of fruit and spice. Delicious.

**Pretty Gorgeous Rosé,
IGP Pays d'Oc**

France | Languedoc-Roussillon

Made from the Cinsault grape, with a dash of Muscat Blanc à Petits Grains, this is a delightful and dainty Rose hailing from the Languedoc- Roussillon region of Southern France. Intense lychee and strawberry notes are greeted with hints of violet and good acidity enabling the wine to be sipped as an aperitif or paired with food, the slight sweetness balancing spice perfectly.

Comte de Provence Rosé, La Vidaubanaise £29.00

France | Provence

La Vidaubanaise is one of the finest co-operatives in Provence and they produce balanced, highly drinkable ro-sés, sold in the retro "flûte à corset" Provence bottle. Currently soaring in popularity, Provence is comfortably the largest producer of rosé in the world, delivering a highly individual style of great elegance. Classic light pink in the glass. A light, bright nose of wild strawberries. Refreshing and smooth on the palate this is a versatile food-friendly wine.

Sancerre Rosé, Domaine des Vieux Pruniers £35.00

France | Loire

The Sancerre region is most famous for its production of Sauvignon Blanc but some beautiful reds and rosés made from the prized Pinot Noir grape should not be overlooked. This is an elegant rosé that is ultra crisp with subtle hints of succulent red fruits. It possesses a lightly aromatic juicy nose of strawberries. The palate is dry, light and fruity with a mouthwatering layer of raspberry fruit.

Prosecco DOC Treviso, Vinicola Serena £8.00

Italy | Veneto

Vinicola Serena was founded in 1881 and since then has never ceased to innovate, adapting to the times and the demands of the market while attention to quality, the environment and especially the customer remain unchanged. A lively crisp sparkling wine with a delicate lemony character and an aromatic, dry, refresh-ing finish. Your own mini bottle!

Prosecco Quadri Extra Dry, Botter £24.00

Italy | Veneto

Botter can draw on traditions dating back almost a hundred years. It has passed through the careful hands of three generations for whom wine was a passion as well as a trade. They have responded to the constantly evolving market over time, in a process of ongoing expansion. Extra dry on a bottle of Prosecco ironically means the wine re-tains a hint of sweetness on the finish, which no doubt accounts for it's popularity today. Lovely citrus and stone fruit aromas. On the palate it's crisp and refreshing with typical white peach and apricots flavours and hints of pears.

La Cuvee, Laurent Perrier 20cl £17.00 / £53.00

France | Champagne

A famous name which lives up to its reputation for consistent quality across the range, Laurent Perrier owns vineyard sites in all three of the major Champagne regions. Freshness, elegance and balance, the defining qual-ities of the range, are showcased in the Brut L-P year after year. Due to a high proportion of Chardonnay in the blend this has a lovely lightness of touch. The ideal aperitif but also excellent throughout the meal particularly with fish and seafood dishes.

France | Champagne

Champagne Bollinger was founded in 1829, and is still 100% family owned today. One of the finest non vintage Champagnes available, always rich, toasty and full bodied, with wonderful concentration and depth of flavour. Many Champagne houses aspire to this style but few succeed as well as Bollinger. The richness and depth of this champagne make it excellent with fuller seafood dishes, but it is also an excellent aperitif

Cuvée Rosé , Laurent Perrier 79.00

France | Champagne

Using only the highest quality Pinot Noir grapes, this is one of the few rosé champagnes that is made by drawing the juice from black grapes in the vat, instead of simply blending red and white wines. This gives it the highly expressive bouquet, extraordinary depth and freshness, and delicious red berry flavours that have made it a benchmark for all rosé champagnes around the world. A wonderful aperitif.
